

Elements of a global market for talent Example: Top 25 US Universities in Mid-Atlantic

- Roughly 20,000 regular faculty (9-10 month contract)
- Hired close to 3000 faculty from 2004 to 2006
 - Almost 5% of total faculty per year
 - Meaning in 10 years close to 50% of total faculty
- Foreign nationals account for 20% of total hires
- Dynamic hiring of tenured professors
 - Over 450 faculty hired with tenure from 2004 to 2006
 - Represents 1% of tenured faculty per year



Academic inbreeding is rampant in European schools, especially in the South





Inbreeding also high in many other regions



United States	Overall Very low Some exceptions (e.g.): Harvard Law School is 81%; Yale Law School is 73%
United Kingdom	17%
France	50%
Portugal	80%
Spain	95%
Japan	Low overall: 34% High on national universities
Russia; Mexico; Korea; China; Singapore; Sweden	High inbreeding rates

Inbreds less engaged in external research contacts, risking knowledge obsolescence





Inbreds have less scientific productivity, substituting with external engagement...


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


US funding mostly from private sources! University of Michigan Budget Sources


Year 2005-2006; Excludes Health System; Total of \$2.3Billion
